TOUR REPORT

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Species which were heard but not seen are indicated by the symbol (H).

Nepal 1996 was one of our best tours yet of this delightful country, not only for the excellent variety of birds and mammals recorded, but also because of the good accommodations and superbly friendly and knowledgeable help of our Nepali guide, Hem Sagar Baral.

We started in the rain in the Kathmandu Valley at Godaveri, finding the localised Slatybacked Flycatcher and a party of Spotted-winged Grosbeaks. Hardly damping our spirits, the rain helped to clear the atmosphere, and next day we got great views of the high Himalayas as we headed south to Chitwan (and we also saw Wallcreepers and Brown Dippers en route). A walk through the grasslands at Chitwan on the first afternoon produced a party of enigmatic Slender-billed Babblers and Black-throated Weavers, and we settled down that evening with the far-distant snows flushed rosy pink away to the north. Three nights at Tiger Tops Tended Camp allowed us to enjoy the peace and tranquillity of this idyllic location, as well as Grey-headed Fishing-Eagle, Giant & Hornbills, Rufous Piculet, Blue-beaded Bee-eaters, Rufous-necked Laughingthrush, Black-backed Forktail, a superb Himalayan Rubythroat, and skulking Large Grass Warblers, Spotted and Pale-footed Bush-Warblers and Dull Slaty-bellied Tesias. After dark, a party of Gaur appeared one evening in the mist outside the bar, a Collared Scops-Owl actually entered the bar, and Brown Hawk-Owls called nosily too. All too soon we transferred through the park to Sauraha at its eastern end, finding Red-breasted Falconets on the way, as well as Gaur, Sloth Bear and Rhinos. Indeed, the last gave our guides quite a start, but far from charging, our guide had to try to chase it off before we could proceed. Our full day at Gaida Wildlife Camp was relaxed, but nevertheless a morning walk produced Tickell's Thrush, a superb male White-tailed Robin, and roosting Collared

Scops-Owl, whilst that afternoon an elephant ride became an 'owl special', with Dusky Horned Owl, Brown Wood Owl and Brown Fish Owl logged in just a couple of hours.

The long drive east from Chitwan to Kosi was notable for the improved state of the roads (most of the way, at least) and a classy Ibisbill. A brief stop at Kosi Barrage turned up the first of several Falcated Ducks, and then it was onto Kosi Tappu Wildlife Camp, a superbly situated, well-run camp with Cinnamon and Black Bitterns and Ruddy and Baillon's Crakes in the garden. Over the next couple of days we found some of the local specialities, including Hodgson's Bushchat, as well as Nepal rarities Blunt-winged Warbler and Blyth's Pipit. The vast numbers of waterfowl attracted raptors, including a majestic Imperial Eagle and several Black (Cinereous) Vultures and Pied and Pallid Harriers. In the waterside vegetation, Siberian Rubythroats, Black-faced Buntings and a host of small brown warblers lurked, although we got surprisingly good views of most species ... eventually.

Bang on time, our flight to Kathmandu was notable for cloud covering all of the mountains, but we made up with some 'culture' in the Kathmandu Valley. Most of the final four days was spent at Phulchowki and Godaveri, and we eventually got good views of Spiny Babbler, whilst other highlights were Kaleej Pheasant, Rufous-bellied Sapsucker, Scaly-breasted Wren-Babbler, Cutia, White's Thrushes, Dusky Thrush, another White-tailed Robin, and White-throated Redstart.

A total of 380 species were recorded on the tour, including four species that were heard only.

Great Crested Grebe Podiceps cristatus: only at Kosi.

Night Heron Nycticorax nycticorax: two large roosts in Chitwan.

Chestnut Bittern *Ixobrychus cinnamomeus:* one briefly in Chitwan, and then several sightings at Kosi Tappu.

Yellow Bittern Ixobrychus sinensis: one at Kosi Tappu was an out-of-season surprise.

Black Bittern Ixobrychus flavicollis: a singleton at Kosi Tappu was very exceptional.

Bittern (Great Bittern) Botaurus stellaris: one at Kosi Tappu.

CICONIIDAE

Openbill Stork (Open-billed Stork) Anastomus oscitans

White-necked Stork Ciconia episcopus: just two, en route to Kosi.

Black Stork Ciconia nigra: several in Chitwan, and up to 13 at Kosi.

Black-necked Stork *Ephippiorhynchus asiaticus:* an adult and an immature on the river at Kosi. An endangered species in the subcontinent.

Lesser Adjutant *Leptoptilos javanicus*: small numbers at Chitwan, and relatively numerous around Kosi.

THRESKIORNITHIDAE

Black-headed Ibis (White Ibis) Threskiornis melanocephalus: only at Kosi.

Black Ibis *Pseudibis papillosa:* a few at Chitwan (often calling from the tree tops), and relatively numerous around Kosi.

Spoonbill (Eurasian Spoonbill) Platalea leucorodia: only at Kosi.

ANATIDAE

Bar-headed Goose Anser indicus: five flying down river at Kosi, and then one seen well by the dam.

Lesser Whistling Teal Dendrocygna javanica: up to 7,500 estimated at Kosi.

Pintail (Northern Pintail) Anas acuta: up to 20,000 guestimated at Kosi.

Red-crested Pochard Netta rufina: one or two at Kosi Tappu.

Ferruginous Duck (White-eyed Pochard) Aythya nyroca: some great views on the smaller ponds at Kosi Tappu.

Cotton Teal Nettapus coromandelianus: six on roadside pools near Kosi Barrage.

Goldeneye (Common Goldeneye) Bucephala clangula: a single female at Kosi Barrage.

Goosander Mergus merganser: a few at Chitwan, mostly at Sauraha.

ACCIPITRIDAE

→ Black-winged Kite (B-shouldered Kite) Elanus caeruleus

Crested Honey Buzzard Pernis ptilorhynchus: two in Chitwan.

Black Kite Milvus migrans: a flock in Kathmandu included a single Black-eared Kite, 'M. lineatus'.

Shikra Accipiter badius

Sparrowhawk (Eurasian Sparrowhawk) Accipiter nisus

Besra Sparrowhawk Accipiter virgatus: a single at Nagarjung.

Long-legged Buzzard Buteo rufinus: one at Kosi Barrage.

Japanese Buzzard (Common Buzzard) Buteo buteo

White-eyed Buzzard-Eagle Butastur teesa: good numbers in Chitwan (at the Meghauli end).

Changeable Hawk-Eagle Spizaetus cirrhatus: several vocal birds at Chitwan.

Bonelli's Eagle Hieraaetus fasciatus: one at Phulchowki.

Imperial Eagle Aquila heliaca: a superb adult sitting on the sandbanks in the Kosi River.

Steppe Eagle Aquila nipalensis: scattered sightings, surprisingly mostly involving adults.

Black Eagle *Ictinaetus malayensis:* seen most days on Phulchowki, including a pair together and a bird in tumbling display flight.

Grey-headed Fishing Eagle *Ichthyophaga ichthyaetus*: two singletons in Chitwan, one over Tiger Tops and one sitting by the river at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

King Vulture Sarcogyps calvus

Cinereous Vulture (Black Vulture) Aegypius monachus: up to seven at Kosi, sitting on the mud banks, with a single over Biratnagar.

Griffon Vulture (Eurasian Griffon) Gyps fulvus: three en route to Chitwan.

Indian Long-billed Vulture (Indian Griffon) Gyps indicus: just a few, at and en route to Chitwan, and over Biratnagar.

Egyptian Vulture Neophron percnopterus

Hen Harrier Circus cyaneus: three singles, including a great adult male near Kosi Tappu.

Pale Harrier (Pallid Harrier) Circus macrourus: two at Kosi.

Pied Harrier Circus melanoleucos: several at Kosi, including good views of males.

Marsh Harrier Circus aeruginosus

Short-toed Eagle Circaetus gallicus: singles at Kosi and at Biratnagar airport.

Crested Serpent Eagle Spilornis cheela

Osprey Pandion haliaetus

FALCONIDAE

Red-breasted Falconet (Collared Falconet) *Microhierax caerulescens*: one at Tiger Tops, and then four near the crocodile farm in Chitwan.

Peregrine Falcon Falco peregrinus

Kestrel (Eurasian Kestrel) Falco tinnunculus

PHASIANIDAE

Black Partridge (Black Francolin) Francolinus francolinus: small numbers at Chitwan.

Swamp Partridge (Swamp Francolin) Francolinus gularis: seen daily at Kosi Tappu.

Common Hill Partridge Arborophila torqueola (H): one heard at very close range at Phulchowki.

Kaleej Pheasant (Kalij Pheasant) Lophura leucomelana: two males and then a female showed very well on the road in the late afternoon at Phulchowki.

GRUIDAE

Common Crane Grus grus: two flocks, totalling over 50 birds, at Chitwan.

RALLIDAE

Water Rail Rallus aquaticus: two at Kosi Tappu.

Baillon's Crake Porzana pusilla: at least two elusive birds at Kosi Tappu.

Ruddy Crake Porzana fusca: good views at Kosi Tappu.

Brown Crake Amaurornis akool: two singletons in Chitwan.

White-breasted Waterhen Amaurornis phoenicurus

Moorhen (Common Moorhen) Gallinula chloropus

Purple Moorhen (Purple Swamphen) Porphyrio porphyrio: a few in Chitwan and then a couple at Kosi.

Coot (Common Coot) Fulica atra

JACANIDAE

Pheasant-tailed Jacana Hydrophasianus chirurgus: up to eight at Kosi.

Bronze-winged Jacana Metopidius indicus: a handful at Kosi.

IBIDORHYNCHIDAE

Ibisbill Ibidorhyncha struthersii: a single on the Rapti River near Hetauda. Whew!

BURHINIDAE

Great Stone Plover *Esacus magnirostris*: great views of ten birds on the island in the Kosi River whilst having lunch.

GLAREOLIDAE

Small Indian Pratincole Glareola lactea: very common at Kosi.

CHARADRIIDAE

Lapwing (Northern Lapwing) Vanellus vanellus: several parties at Kosi.

LARIDAE

Yellow-legged Gull Larus cachinnans: up to three immatures at Kosi.

Great Black-headed Gull Larus ichthyaetus: a single adult at Kosi.

Indian River Tern Sterna aurantia: only at Kosi.

Black-bellied Tern Sterna acuticauda: only on the river trip at Kosi.

COLUMBIDAE

Pompadour Green Pigeon Treron pompadora: one at Kosi Tappu.

Orange-breasted Green Pigeon Treron bicincta: a few at Chitwan and Kosi Tappu.

Yellow-legged Green Pigeon Treron phoenicoptera

Blue Rock Pigeon (Rock Dove) Columba livia

Rufous Turtle Dove Streptopoveelia orientalis: up to three at Kosi Tappu, then three at Godaveri.

Indian Ring Dove (Collared Dove) Streptopelia decaocto

Red Turtle Dove Streptopelia tranquebarica: only at Gaida in Chitwan.

Spotted Dove Streptopelia chinensis

Emerald Dove Chalcophaps indica: many sightings from elephant back in Chitwan.

PSITTACIDAE

Alexandrine Parakeet Psittacula eupatria

Rose-ringed Parakeet Psittacula krameri

Red-breasted Parakeet *Psittacula alexandri*: quite common in Chitwan. Note the short tail!

Blossom-headed Parakeet Psittacula cyanocephala: only in Chitwan.

CUCULIDAE

Common Hawk-Cuckoo *Cuculus varius*: very vocal at both Chitwan and (pre-dawn!) at Kosi Tappu, with several sightings.

Indian Banded Bay Cuckoo Cacomantis sonneratii: one seen in Chitwan.

Koel (Asian Koel) Eudynamys scolopacea: a single male at Kosi Tappu.

Large Green-billed Malkoha Rhopodytes tristis: two at Chitwan.

Coucal (Greater Coucal) Centropus sinensis

Lesser Coucal Centropus toulou: one at Kosi Tappu Wildlife Camp.

STRIGIDAE

Oriental Scops Owl *Otus sunia* (H): heard at Tiger Tops Tented Camp, but despite searching, not seen.

Collared Scops Owl Otus bakkamoena: one coming into the bar at Tiger Tops Tented Camp to feed (and also heard there, giving the call typical of bakkamoena (rather than the plains form lempiji), and one seen at a daytime roost at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Dusky Horned Owl *Bubo coromandus:* a single seen from elephant back at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Brown Fish Owl Bubo zeylonensis: a single seen from elephant back at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Collared Pygmy Owlet *Glaucidium brodiei* (H): heard a few times on Phulchowki and at Nagarjung.

Jungle Owlet Glaucidium radiatum: several sightings at Chitwan.

Barred Owlet Glaucidium cuculoides: just one, at Godaveri.

Brown Hawk-Owl *Ninox scutulata:* very vocal at Tiger Tops Tented Camp, and seen there twice.

Spotted Owlet Athene brama: several at Chitwan (Gaida) and Kosi.

Brown Wood Owl *Strix leptogrammica:* a single seen from elephant back at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Short-eared Owl Asio flammeus: one at Kosi Barrage.

APODIDAE

Alpine Swift Apus melba: a vocal flock at Kosi Barrage.

House Swift (Little Swift) Apus affinis: the form in Nepal is now often split from the Little Swift of the plains of India, the Middle East and Africa, as House Swift A. nipalensis. The identification of these in the field is unstudied however, and the form occurring in some areas (e.g. Biratnagar) open to question.

Palm Swift (Asian Palm Swift) Cypsiurus balasiensis: several at Biratnagar (the Asian form is sometimes lumped with African Palm Swift C. parvus)..

ALCEDINIDAE

Lesser Pied Kingfisher (Pied Kingfisher) Ceryle rudis

Common Kingfisher Alcedo atthis

Stork-billed Kingfisher Pelargopsis capensis: one or two at Chitwan and Kosi Tappu.

White-breasted Kingfisher Halcyon smyrnensis

MEROPIDAE

Green Bee-eater (Little Green Bee-eater) Merops orientalis

Blue-bearded Bee-eater *Nyctyornis athertoni:* heard on the lower slopes of Phulchowki, and pairs seen at Gaida Camp and from elephant back near Tiger Tops.

CORACIIDAE

Indian Roller Coracias benghalensis

UPUPIDAE

Hoopoe (Eurasian Hoopoe) Upupa epops

BUCEROTIDAE

Indian Pied Hornbill (Pied Hornbill) Anthracoceros malabaricus: just four seen, in Chitwan.

Great Pied Hornbill (Great Hornbill) Buceros bicornis: great views of up to three near Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

CAPITONIDAE

Great Hill Barbet (Great Barbet) *Megalaima virens*: heard daily on Phulchowki, and seen briefly on two dates.

Blue-throated Barbet Megalaima asiatica: good views at Kosi Tappu.

PICIDAE

Wryneck (Eurasian Wryneck) Jynx torquilla

Rufous Piculet (White-browed Piculet) Sasia ochracea: one volatile bird near Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

Rufous Woodpecker Micropterus brachyurus: a pair at Tiger Tops Lodge.

Little Scaly-bellied Green Woodpecker Picus myrmecophoneus

Black-naped Green Woodpecker (Grey-headed Woodpecker) *Picus canus:* recorded at Chitwan and Godaveri.

Small Yellow-naped Woodpecker Picus chlorolophus

Lesser Golden-backed Woodpecker *Dinopium benghalense*: one at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Himalayan Golden-backed (Three-toed) Woodpecker Dinopium shorii

Rufous-bellied Sapsucker Hypopicus hyperythrus: two on the upper slopes of Phulchowki.

Darjeeling Pied Woodpecker Picoides darjellensis

Brown-fronted Pied Woodpecker Picoides auriceps: one on Phulchowki.

Fulvous-breasted Pied Woodpecker Picoides macei: seen commonly in Chitwan.

Grey-crowned Pygmy Woodpecker Picoides canicapillus

Bay Woodpecker (Red-eared Bay Woodpecker) Blythipicus pyrrhotis: one seen and another heard on the upper slopes of Phulchowki.

ALAUDIDAE

Bush Lark (Rufous-winged Bush Lark) *Mirafra assamica*: small numbers at Chitwan and Kosi Barrage.

Ashy-crowned Finch-Lark *Eremopterix grisea*: a few en route to Kosi Barrage and at Kosi Tappu.

Sand Lark Calandrella raytal: abundant at Kosi.

HIRUNDINIDAE

Plain Sand Martin (Brown-throated Sand Martin) Riparia paludicola

Swallow (Barn Swallow) Hirundo rustica

Red-rumped Swallow Hirundo daurica: two small parties en route to, and at, Chitwan.

LANIIDAE

Grey-backed Shrike Lanius tephronotus: odd ones throughout the tour.

Rufous-backed Shrike (Long-tailed Shrike) Lanius schach: only the black-headed form L. s. tricolor was seen.

Brown Shrike *Lanius cristatus*: a few around Kosi, and a singleton at the Manora River, Kathmandu.

ORIOLIDAE

Black-headed Oriole Oriolus xanthornus

Maroon Oriole Oriolus traillii: two sightings on Phulchowki.

DICRURIDAE

Black Drongo Dicrurus macrocercus

Ashy Drongo Dicrurus leucophaeus: just three, in Chitwan.

White-bellied Drongo Dicrurus caerulescens: only at Chitwan.

Bronzed Drongo Dicrurus aeneus

Hair-crested Drongo Dicrurus hottentottus

Greater Racket-tailed Drongo Dicrurus paradiseus: one in Chitwan.

ARTAMIDAE

Ashy Swallow-Shrike (Ashy Wood-Swallow) Artamus fuscus: a large flock huddling together in the tree tops at Gaida Wildlife Camp, and three at Kosi Tappu.

STURNIDAE

Grey-headed Myna Sturnus malabaricus

Starling (Common Starling) Sturnus vulgaris: several groups at Kosi.

Pied Myna Sturnus contra

Common Myna Acridotheres tristis

Bank Myna Acridotheres ginginianus: a few roadside birds at Kosi.

Jungle Myna Acridotheres fuscus

CORVIDAE

Red-crowned Jay (Eurasian Jay) Garrulus glandarius

Green Magpie Cissa chinensis: just one, briefly, in Chitwan.

Yellow-billed Blue Magpie Cissa flavirostris: at least four near the summit of Phulchowki.

Red-billed Blue Magpie (Blue Magpie) Cissa flavirostris: seen at both Nagarjung and Godaveri.

CAMPEPHAGIDAE

Pied Flycatcher-Shrike Hemipus picatus

Common Wood Shrike Tephrodornis pondicerianus: only in Chitwan.

Large Cuckoo-Shrike Coracina novaehollandiae: only in Chitwan.

Smaller Grey Cuckoo-Shrike Coracina melaschistos: again, only at Chitwan.

Scarlet Minivet Pericrocotus flammeus

Long-tailed Minivet Pericrocotus ethologus: a few around Phulchowki.

Small Minivet Pericrocotus cinnamomeus

IRENIDAE

Common Iora Aegithina tiphia

Golden-fronted Leaf Bird Chloropsis aurifrons: only at Chitwan.

Orange-bellied Leaf Bird Chloropsis hardwickii: several noisy birds on Phulchowki.

PYCNONOTIDAE

Black-headed Yellow Bulbul Pycnonotus flaviventris: just one, in Chitwan.

Red-whiskered Bulbul Pycnonotus jocosus

White-cheeked Bulbul Pycnonotus leucogenys

Red-vented Bulbul Pycnonotus caffer

Rufous-bellied Bulbul (Mountain Bulbul) Hypsipetes mcclellandi: some large flocks on Phulchowki.

Black Bulbul (Grey Bulbul) *Hypsipetes madagascariensis:* some very large flocks on Phulchowki. feeding on 'bottle-brush' flowers.

TIMALIIDAE

Spotted Babbler Pellorneum ruficeps: nice views at Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

Slaty-headed Scimitar Babbler *Pomatorhinus schisticeps*: a pair taped out near Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

Rufous-necked Scimitar Babbler Pomatorhinus ruficollis: seen a couple of times on

Phulchowki.

Rusty-cheeked Scimitar Babbler Pomatorhinus erythrogenys

Scaly-breasted Wren-Babbler *Pnoepyga albiventer*: one showed extremely well near the summit of Phulchowki, and another was seen briefly near the ravine.

Lesser Scaly-breasted Wren-Babbler (Pygmy Wren-Babbler) *Pnoepyga pusilla:* only frustratingly brief views at Nagarjung and Phulchowki.

Red-billed Babbler (Black-chinned Babbler) Stachyris pyrrhops

Black-throated Babbler *Stachyris nigriceps*: seen and heard on the lower slopes of Phulchowki, and one seen well at Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

Yellow-breasted Babbler *Macronous gularis*: great views at Tiger Tops Tented Camp. Red-capped Babbler *Timalia pileata*

Yellow-eyed Babbler Chrysomma sinense: common at Chitwan.

Striated Babbler Turdoides earlei: a few at Chitwan, and common at Kosi.

Slender-billed Babbler *Turdoides longirostris*: good views of two parties in Chitwan. Jungle Babbler *Turdoides striatus*

Spiny Babbler *Turdoides nipalensis*: pairs seen on two days at Godaveri, and gave excellent views on the last day there.

White-throated Laughing Thrush Garrulax albogularis: two parties on Phulchowki. Striated Laughing Thrush Garrulax striatus: several on Phulchowki.

White-crested Laughing Thrush *Garrulax leucolophus:* only in Godaveri Botanical Gardens.

Rufous-necked Laughing Thrush Garrulax ruficollis: good views at Tiger Tops Lodge.

Streaked Laughing Thrush *Garrulax lineatus:* quite common on the upper slopes of Phulchowki.

Red-headed Laughing Thrush Garrulax erythrocephalus

Red-billed Leiothrix Leiothrix lutea: seen well at Godaveri Botanical Gardens.

Nepal Cutia Cutia nipalensis: exciting views of at least four on Phulchowki.

Red-winged Shrike-Babbler Pteruthius flaviscapis: a single male on Phulchowki.

Chestnut-throated Shrike-Babbler *Pteruthius melanotis*: two elusive birds on Phulchowki.

Hoary Barwing Actinodura nipalensis: seen on the upper slopes of Phulchowki.

Bar-throated Siva (Bar-throated Minla) Minla strigula

Blue-winged Siva (Blue-winged Minla) Minla cyanouroptera: just one, on Phulchowki.

Red-breasted Flycatcher Muscicapa parva

Orange-gorgeted Flycatcher Muscicapa strophiata

Rufous-breasted Blue Flycatcher Muscicapa hyperythra (H): heard only at Nagarjung.

Rusty-breasted Blue Flycatcher *Muscicapa hodgsonii*: a male and female at Godaveri Botanical Gardens.

Slaty Blue Flycatcher Muscicapa leucomelanura

Small Niltava Muscicapa macgrigoriae: eventually seen well at Godaveri.

Rufous-bellied Niltava Muscicapa sundara: only one, at Godaveri Botanical Gardens.

Brooks's Flycatcher Muscicapa poliogenys: common in Chitwan.

Verditer Flycatcher Muscicapa thalassina

SYLVIIDAE

Dull Slaty-bellied Ground Warbler *Tesia cyaniventer*: seen at Tiger Tops Tented Camp and, rather better, at Nagarjung.

Chestnut-headed Ground Warbler *Tesia castaneocoronata*: several sightings at Phulchowki, and also one at Nagarjung, but all were brief and elusive.

Large Bush Warbler Cettia major: one seen very well at Kosi Tappu.

Pale-footed Bush Warbler (Blanford's Bush Warbler) Cettia pallidipes: a couple near Tiger Tops Tented Camp, but very skulking.

Aberrant Bush Warbler Cettia flavolivacea

Rufous-capped Bush Warbler Cettia brunnifrons

Spotted Bush Warbler *Bradypterus thoracicus*: two at Chitwan, showing well, and two also at Kosi Tappu.

Fantail Warbler (Golden-headed Cisticola) Cisticola exilis: one on the picnic island in the Kosi River.

Streaked Fantail Warbler (Zitting Cisticola) Cisticola juncidis

Hodgson's Wren-Warbler (Grey-capped Prinia) Prinia cinereocapilla: only in Chitwan.

Franklin's Wren-Warbler (Grey-breasted Prinia) *Prinia hodgsonii*: only in Chitwan, but rather commoner than the above.

Streaked Wren-Warbler (Graceful Prinia) Prinia gracilis: several south of Kosi Barrage. Plain Wren-Warbler (Plain Prinia) Prinia inornata

Ashy Wren-Warbler (Ashy Prinia) Prinia socialis: just three, at Chitwan.

Yellow-bellied Wren-Warbler (Yellow-bellied Prinia) Prinia flaviventris: only one, at Chitwan.

Large Grass Warbler Graminicola bengalensis: two at Chitwan, but quite skulking.

Tailor Bird (Common Tailorbird) Orthotomus sutorius

Striated Marsh Warbler Megalurus palustris: common around Kosi.

Indian Great Reed Warbler (Clamorous Reed Warbler) Acrocephalus stentoreus: just one, at Kosi Tappu.

Blyth's Reed Warbler Acrocephalus dumetorum: one at Tiger Tops Tented Camp, but quite common at Kosi Tappu.

Paddyfield Warbler Acrocephalus agricola: singles at Chitwan and Kosi.

Blunt-winged Warbler Acrocephalus concinens: one at Kosi Tappu.

Chiffchaff *Phylloscopus collybita*: a couple at Chitwan, and quite common at Kosi Tappu.

Tickell's Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus affinis: common at Kosi Tappu.

Smoky Willow Warbler (Smoky Warbler) *Phylloscopus fuligiventer:* quite common in waterside vegetation at Chitwan and Kosi Tappu.

Dusky Leaf Warbler (Dusky Warbler) *Phylloscopus fuscatus:* abundant at Kosi Tappu. Orange-barred Leaf Warbler *Phylloscopus pulcher*

Yellow-browed Leaf Warbler *Phylloscopus inornatus*: most were Hume's Yellow-browed Warbler *P. (i.) humei*, but birds giving the distinctive call of the nominate race were at Kosi Tappu and Godaveri Botanical Gardens.

Lemon-rumped Warbler *Phylloscopus chloronotus*: only seen in Godaveri Botanical Gardens.

Grey-faced Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus maculipennis: a few on Phulchowki.

Dull Green Leaf Warbler (Greenish Warbler) *Phylloscopus trochiloides:* quite common at Chitwan and Kosi Tappu.

Blyth's Leaf Warbler Phylloscopus reguloides: small numbers throughout.

Black-browed Flycatcher-Warbler Seicercus burkii

Grey-headed Flycatcher-Warbler Seicercus xanthoschistos

Chestnut-headed Flycatcher-Warbler Seicercus castaniceps: several skittish birds on Phulchowki.

Black-faced Flycatcher-Warbler Abroscopus schisticeps: great views of several flocks on Phulchowki.

TURDIDAE

Rubythroat (Siberian Rubythroat) Erithacus calliope: seen well at Kosi Tappu.

Bluethroat Erithacus svecicus: just small numbers at Chitwan and Kosi Tappu.

Himalayan Rubythroat *Erithacus pectoralis*: good views of two males at Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

Orange-flanked Bush Robin (Red-flanked Bluetail) Erithacus cyanurus: quite a few around Phulchowki and Godaveri, including some nice males.

Golden Bush Robin Erithacus chrysaeus: heard most days in the Kathmandu Valley, but only seen once (a female on Phulchowki).

Magpie-Robin (Oriental Magpie-Robin) Copsychus saularis

Shama (White-rumped Shama) Copsychus malabaricus: small numbers at Chitwan.

Black Redstart Phoenicurus ochruros

Hodgson's Redstart Phoenicurus hodgsoni: several around Godaveri.

Blue-fronted Redstart Phoenicurus frontalis

White-throated Redstart *Phoenicurus schisticeps:* a male and female on the summit of Phulchowki was a surprise.

Plumbeous Redstart Rhyacornis fuliginosus

White-tailed Blue Robin Cinclidium leucurum: good views of males at Gaida Wildlife Camp and Nagarjung. Normally a very hard bird to seen in the winter.

Black-backed Forktail *Enicurus immaculatus:* nice views of one at Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

Spotted Forktail Enicurus maculatus: seen twice Phulchowki, but only briefly.

Hodgson's Bush Chat Saxicola insignis: a male on the picnic island at Kosi Tappu.

Stonechat (Common Stonechat) Saxicola torquata

White-tailed Stonechat Saxicola leucura: quite common at Chitwan, and a few at Kosi.

Pied Bush Chat Saxicola caprata

Dark-grey Bush Chat Saxicola ferrea: a few around Godaveri.

White-capped Redstart Chaimarrornis leucocephalus

Chestnut-bellied Rock Thrush Monticola rufiventris: a male on Phulchowki.

Blue Rock Thrush *Monticola solitarius*: singles en route to Chitwan and between Chitwan and Kosi.

Blue Whistling Thrush Myiophonus caeruleus

Golden Mountain Thrush (Scaly Thrush, White's Thrush) Zoothera dauma: seen very well at Nagarjung, and singles also at Chitwan and Godaveri.

Tickell's Thrush *Turdus unicolor:* a male and at least two females at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

White-collared Blackbird *Turdus albocinctus*: a male on the upper slopes of Phulchowki.

Grey-winged Blackbird *Turdus boulboul:* several at Godaveri, and also one at Nagarjung.

Black-throated Thrush *Turdus ruficollis:* very few recorded, most notably about ten near Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Dusky Thrush *Turdus naumanni*: a smashing bird by the Manora River in the Kathmandu Valley was a surprise.

CINCLIDAE

Brown Dipper Cinclus pallasi: three en route to Chitwan.

PRUNELLIDAE

Rufous-breasted Accentor Prunella strophiata: one on Phulchowki.

PARIDAE

Grey Tit (Great Tit) Parus major: a few at Godaveri and common at Chitwan.

Green-backed Tit Parus monticolus

Yellow-cheeked Tit Parus xanthogenys

Yellow-browed Tit Sylviparus modestus: some great views of this aberrant tit on Phulchowki.

Red-headed Tit Aegithalos concinnus

SITTIDAE

Chestnut-bellied Nuthatch Sitta castanea: common in Chitwan, and also seen at Godaveri and Nagarjung, and in the centre of Kathmandu!

White-tailed Nuthatch Sitta himalayensis

Velvet-fronted Nuthatch Sitta frontalis

Wall Creeper Tichodroma muraria: two en route to Chitwan.

CERTHIIDAE

Sikkim Tree Creeper Certhia discolor: good views of several on Phulchowki.

MOTACILLIDAE

Indian Tree Pipit (Olive-backed Pipit) Anthus hodgsoni

Paddyfield Pipit Anthus rufulus

Richard's Pipit Anthus richardi: two singles at Chitwan, with another at Kosi. The large, long-tailed, migratory form.

Blyth's Pipit Anthus godlewskii: a flock of about a dozen at Kosi Barrage.

Vinaceous-breasted Pipit (Rosy Pipit) Anthus roseatus: several at Chitwan, notably on the river at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava: just three, at Kosi.

Yellow-headed Wagtail (Citrine Wagtail) *Motacilla citreola:* three in Chitwan (Gaida) and one at Kosi Barrage.

DICAEIDAE

Fire-breasted Flowerpecker Dicaeum ignipectus: good views of several on Phulchowki.

NECTARINIDAE

Purple Sunbird Nectarinia asiatica: just one, at Kosi Barrage.

Nepal Yellow-backed Sunbird Aethopyga nipalensis

Black-breasted Sunbird Aethopyga saturata: one at Godaveri.

Yellow-backed Sunbird (Crimson Sunbird) Aethopyga siparaja: just one, at the Ibisbill stop.

Fire-tailed Sunbird Aethopyga ignicauda: a few out-of-plumage birds on Phulchowki.

ZOSTEROPIDAE

White-eye (Oriental White-eye) Zosterops palpebrosa

PLOCEIDAE

House Sparrow Passer domesticus

Tree Sparrow Passer montanus

Yellow-throated Sparrow Petronia xanthocollis: one at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

Baya (Baya Weaver) Ploceus philippinus

Black-throated Weaver Bird *Ploceus benghalensis*: a party on the first day at Tiger Tops Tented Camp.

Avadavat (Red Munia) Estrilda amandava: a few at Kosi Tappu.

White-backed Munia (Sharp-tailed Munia) Lonchura striata: a few in Chitwan.

Spotted Munia (Scaly-breasted Munia) Lonchura punctulata: common at Gaida Wildlife Camp.

FRINGILLIDAE

Spotted-winged Grosbeak Coccothraustes melanozanthos: a party of 12 flying over on

the first afternoon on Phulchowki.

Nepal Rosefinch (Dark-breasted Rosefinch) Carpodacus nipalensis: five near the summit of Phulchowki.

Pink-browed Rosefinch Carpodacus rhodochrous: about four on Phulchowki. Brown Bullfinch Pyrrhula nipalensis: great views of a feeding party on Phulchowki.

EMBERIZIDAE

Yellow-breasted Bunting *Emberiza aureola:* small numbers only at Chitwan, and rather more at Kosi Tappu (coming into roost).

Black-faced Bunting Emberiza spodocephala: a couple of skulking birds at Kosi Tappu.

Crested Bunting Melophus lathami: a couple in Chitwan, and several at Kosi Tappu.

MAMMALS

Indian Flying Fox *Pteropus giganteus*: one at Kosi Tappu Wildlife Camp, and then a group in Biratnagar.

Rhesus Macaque Macaca mulatta

Hanuman Langur (Common Langur) Presbytis entellus

Golden Jackal Canis aureus: several at Kosi Tappu.

Sloth Bear Melursus ursinus: one on the road in Chitwan.

Yellow-throated Marten Martes flavigula: one briefly in Chitwan.

Smooth-coated Otter Lutra perspicillata: one on the river near Tiger Tops.

Small Indian Mongoose Herpestes auropunctatus: two at Kosi Tappu.

Indian Grey Mongoose (Common Mongoose) Herpestes edwardsii: several sightings in Chitwan.

Jungle Cat Felis chaus: one at dusk in Sauraha Village, Chitwan.

Indian Rhinoceros *Rhinoceros unicornis:* seen from jeep, elephant back and, more excitingly, on foot, in Chitwan.

Wild Boar (Indian Wild Boar) Sus scrofa

Indian Muntjac (Barking Deer) Muntiacus muntjak: several in Chitwan, and heard on Phulchowki.

Spotted Deer (Chital) Cervus axis

Hog-Deer Cervus porcinus

Sambar Cervus unicolor

Water Buffalo Bubalus arnee: several wild-type animals at Kosi Tappu.

Gaur (Indian Bison) Bos gaurus: at least four in the mist from the bar after dark at Tiger Tops Tented Camp, and then a splendid beast from the land rover.

Northern Palm Squirrel Funambulus palmarum

Irrawaddy Squirrel Callosciurus pygerythrus: one in Chitwan.

Orange-bellied Himalayan Squirrel Dremomys lokriah

Indian Hare Lepus nigricollis: one south of Kosi Barrage.

REPTILES & AMPHIBIANS

Mugger (Marsh Crocodile) Crocodylus palustris: several in Chitwan. Indian Python Python molurus: one at Tiger Tops, from elephant back. Brindled House Gecko Hemidactylus frenatus: several at Gaida Wildlife Camp. Common Garden Lizard Calotes versicolar: two at Gaida Wildlife Camp.
