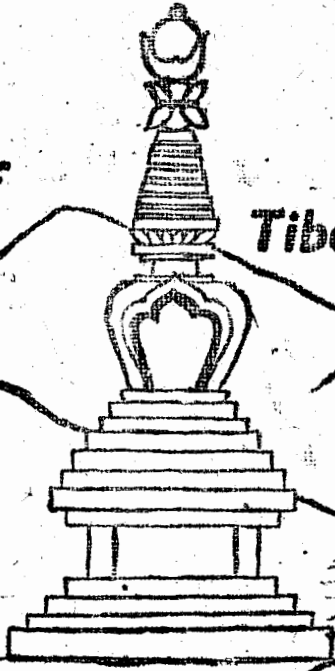


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The Bulletin of Tibetology seeks to serve the reader with an interest in this field of study. The motif portraying the Stupa on the mountains suggests the dimensions of the field.

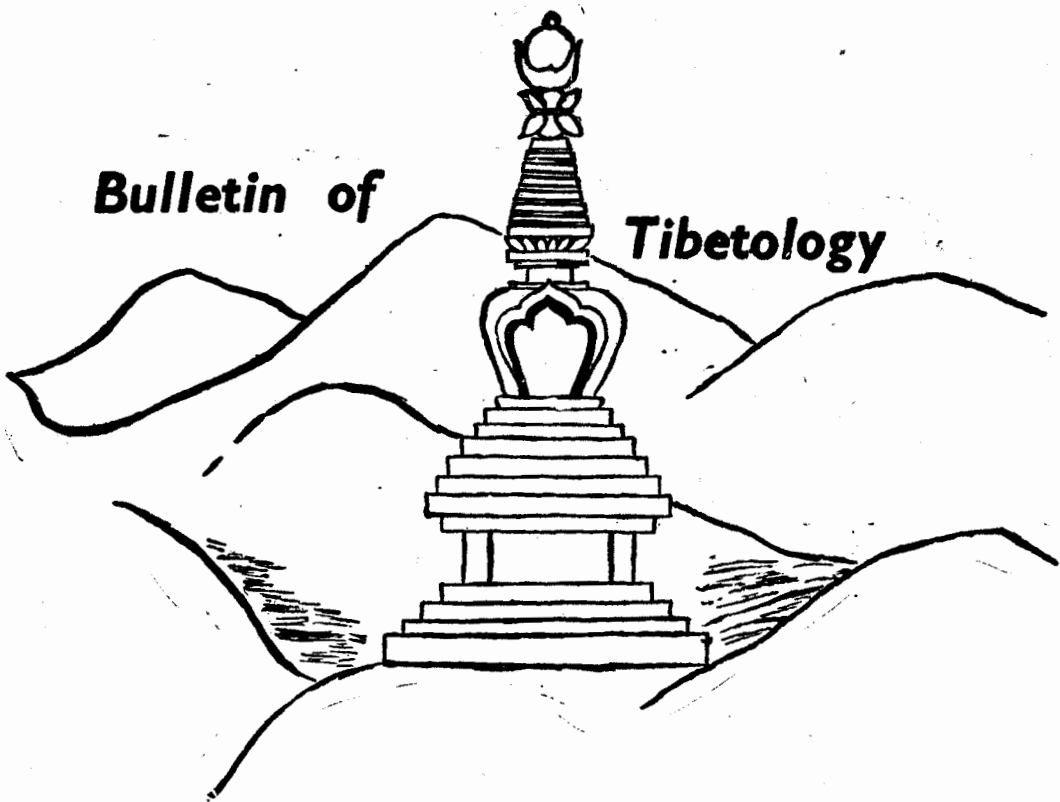
