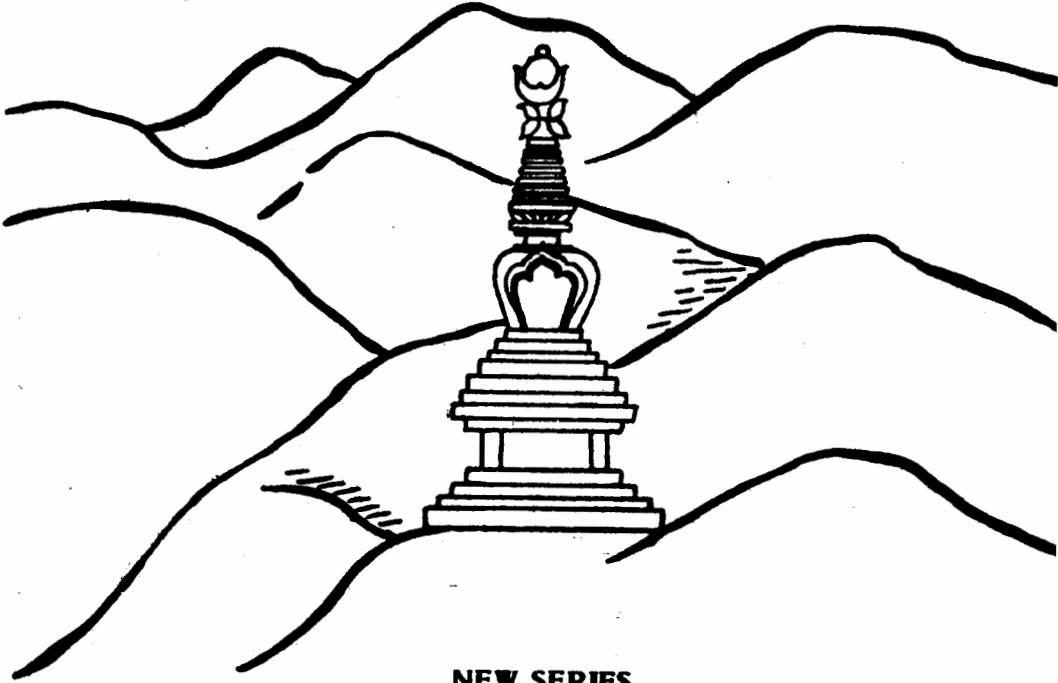

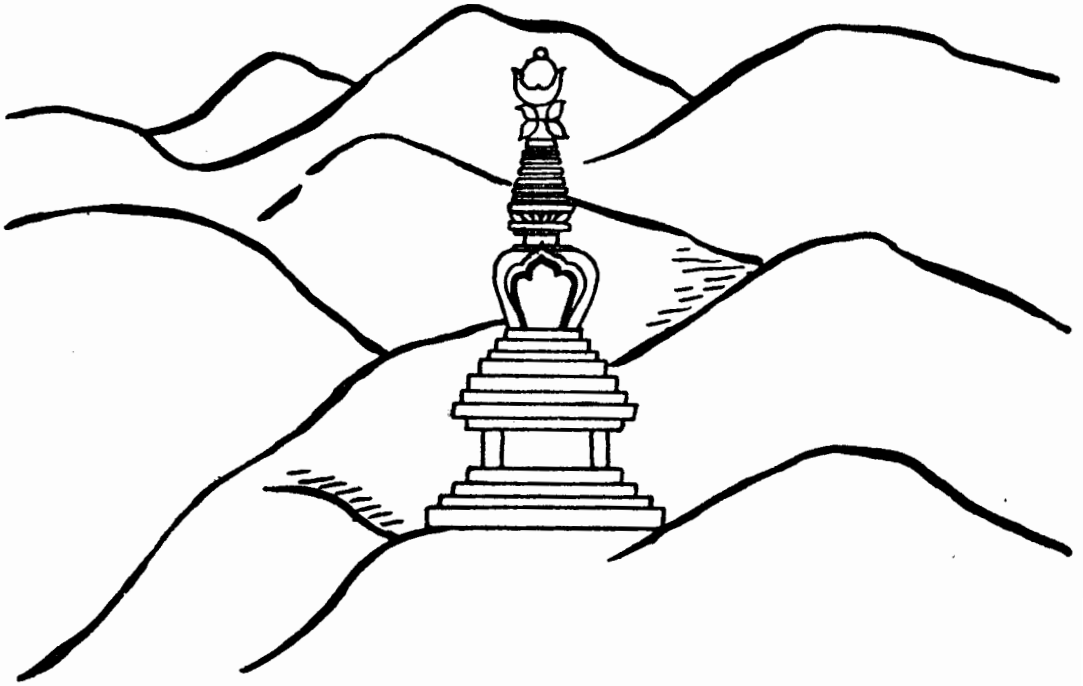

HELMUT EIMER Born 1936 in Pomerania (Stettin); studied Classical Philology, Sanskrit and Tibetan at Hamburg, Berlin and Bonn; specializes in Northern Buddhist traditions and literary sources; authority on life and works of Dipankara Atisa; currently with Indology Seminar of Frederick William University at Bonn.

KUNGA YONTEN HOCHOTSANG Follower of Sakya Order from Derge (Kham); resident in Sikkim since 1959 and attached to the Sikkim Research Institute of Tibetology, first as a student of Sanskrit and English, later English Language Teacher, Sikkim Institute of Higher Nyingmapa Studies (Sheda) and Senior Tibetan Teacher, Tashi Namgyal Academy; and presently Research Officer at the Sikkim Research Institute of Tibetology.

JAMPAL KUNZANG RECHUNG Comes of the Pheunkhang House, Lhasa; had first schooling in Drepung and Rechung Phu areound Lhasa; had schooling in modern subjects in India, Holland and England collaborating with Tibetologists; currently Deputy Director, Sikkim Reasearch Institute of Tibetology.

NIRMAL CHANDRA SINHA Founder Director, Sikkim Research institute of Tibetology; was Centenary Professor of International Relations; History at Calcutta University.
